We're kicking off our third annual Power of Home fundraiser in partnership with Consumers Energy on April 10th. For every \$2 that the public donates, Consumers will match \$1 on every donation up to \$10,000 until match funds run out! Last year the match funds (\$100,000) ran out in 3 days!

Housing Programs

Home Repair Program - Since we have expanded our repair program in 2021, we have been able to provide critical repairs to 14 homeowners needing a hand up not a handout. We even went back and completed a second phase of work on three projects. As we start 2023, we anticipate serving one Program Partner with a second phase of work and will complete an additional 8-10 new repair projects.

We accept Home Repair Program applications the following months each year: February, March, August, September and October. We may hold additional application periods as needed.

Homeownership Program - On February 17th, we sold our 25th Habitat for Humanity home to Michael Jenkins! Michael is settling into his new home nicely and we are excited to finish the landscaping work this spring!

We are embarking on three homeownership projects starting this build season. We are building two new builds in Indian River and rehabbing a home in Cheboygan! This will be by far the largest impact we will have made in our community in the 29 years since we were founded.

We are actively seeking community members who lived or worked in Cheboygan County for the last year who are interested in homeownership through Habitat to get connected with us to start the process to determine if you are mortgage ready and if not take the appropriate steps to get mortgage ready. 


We are always seeking more funding to help us offer these services at an affordable rate to community members during the last chapter of their life.



Square Foot Club Campaign

Every year as we approach the new build season, we put out our annual square foot campaign. This campaign works to raise funds for our upcoming projects by purchasing one square foot of building materials or individual items needed for upcoming projects. Last year we set a goal to raise \$400,000 to help us complete a home rehab project, start a second one and complete up to 14 home repairs. We are excited to let you know that we were able to raise that goal through donations, grants, a home sale and special events.

The ReStore is the perfect place to help you get everything ready for all of the beautiful weather, fun and projects to come. We've been busy starting our own spring cleaning to prepare for the busy season that is fast approaching!



If you haven't visited with us lately, you've missed our updated shelving and the new look of some of our departments.

We've recently upgraded many of our shelves with newly built, matching shelves to better display our books, music, movies and games.

We have organized and streamlined our departments to make it easier for you to find what you are looking for.



We've reorganized the toilet and sink area to better display these items to make them accessible for customers.

Sales of donated items help Habitat for Humanity partner with local families to build, rehabilitate and repair safe and affordable homes in your community and around the world — a good deal for you, your community and the environment. Together, we can help families achieve the strength, stability and self-reliance they need to build a better future while creating stronger neighborhoods.



If you have good, gently used items to donate, we have two options for you. We currently accept donations Tuesday – Friday from 10am – 3pm. Appointments are no longer needed. You can call ahead to discuss your items or stop in at the front counter when you arrive at the store. We are closed to the public, but in the building on Tuesdays, so you will need to call us when you arrive.

We are currently doing Tuesday and Thursday donation pick-ups. We have a list of donations we are currently accepting on our webpage www.habitatcheboygan.org.

From there you can even start the donation process by filling out a form and we will reach out to you to schedule a pick-up or you can call (231) 597-9463, Ext. 1 to schedule ahead.

Are you selling your home, planning on buying a new one or doing a major remodel? Or moving? The ReStore can help you find a new home for your extra furniture, household items, tools, appliances, etc. that you can't take with you. We can work with you to schedule a whole house pick-up to help ready your home for sale or to make room for all the things coming in to your new home. Just by calling (231) 597-9463, Ext. 1, we can set up a time for a walk-through where we can create a plan to best help you with your furniture and other donations. During the walk-through, we can discuss exactly what you would like to donate and even mark it for easy pick-up on the date that we schedule for you.

Moving or Remodeling?

Did you know that the Habitat ReStore will work with you, your realtor or your contractor to collect any acceptable donations from your home.

Call in advance to schedule a walk through appointment and get your whole house pick up scheduled.

Deconstructing a Home?

Habitat will consider taking donations of homes to be relocated off property. Donated homes like this can help make it more affordable for us to rehab homes.

Our ReStore will also consider taking usable items out of your home if you are deconstructing it to build a new home!



Are you planning to tear down a house to make room for a new build? Doing a complete remodel on a current structure? Or want to donate the entire house from your property? Cheboygan County Habitat for Humanity can help with that!

The ReStore is a great place to donate your good double pane windows, doors, kitchen cabinets, fixtures and appliances. Why send these good, reusable items to a landfill when they can help us further our mission to provide safe, affordable housing to people in our community? Just by calling (231) 597-9463, you can help a family realize their dream of homeownership.

Our box truck was purchased in 2009 and it is nearing the end of its drivable life. The box truck is the livelihood of the ReStore. We pick up on average 50 pickups a month and a new truck could help us double that number. We also use the truck to help pick up and deliver construction items to and from jobsites.

We have already secured some grant funding from Presque Isle Electric and Gas Co-op – Thank you PIE&G. We need one \$10,000 sponsor or two \$5,000 sponsorships to help us purchase a truck. These sponsors will have their names and logos included on our truck design.
